Instructions

- 1. Assemble TWO large square pegboards as shown below left to create the field. Cut out the individual halves of the chart and tape them together so that you can see the whole design at once. To create the other pieces, you will only need one pegboard at a time. If you're using clear pegboards, slide the actual-size pattern underneath them. Now place all the beads for your project.
- 2. Cover the completed design with the ironing paper. Keeping the iron level, gently iron the beads in a circular motion for about 10 seconds to fuse the beads evenly. Ironed properly, the beads will still have an open center. On a 3-D project such as this, DO NOT OVER-IRON the beads as it will make the centers of the beads close and can make assembly difficult.
- 3. Once the design is cool, peel off the ironing paper. Lift your design from the pegboard; flip the design over and repeat step #2. Your pegboard and ironing paper are reusable.

Assembly

Insert the football players' feet into the slots in the field.





Goal Posts & Football

Bead Color/# Needed:

Cheddar - 231

Brown - 24

Assembly





Align the field goal post with the base segment to create a foot. Set the assembled field goal post in the end zone on the field, add the football, and toss the coin to start the game!

Two players sit at opposite ends of a smooth, level table.

Using a Perler football, each player takes one turn gently pushing the football with their finger tips towards the goal line at the opposite end of the table.

The objective is to get any part of the football to hang over the opposite edge of the table without it falling off.

Any part of the football hanging over the edge of the table counts as a touchdown and is worth 6 points.

After a touchdown, the player then attempts to "kick" a field goal by flicking the football with their index or middle fingers between the uprights of the field goal post.



"Kicking" the football between the uprights is worth an additional 1 point.

Getting a touchdown and "kicking" a field goal is worth a total of 7 points.

The game then continues until one player reaches 35 points (or a predetermined number agreed upon before the game began).
