

Giant Pet Spider



YOU WILL NEED:

Pegboards:

Large square

Other:

Paper clay: white

Quick-drying adhesive

Bead Colors:

- Red - 66
- Dark Grey - 83
- Black - 852
- Haunted Nite Stripe* - 14
- Kiwi Grape Stripe* - 27

* Find these bead colors in kit # 80-72878 Creepy Spider, or substitute orange and purple

Bead Stems:




Body and Head

Looks like Fang, the giant pet spider escaped his cage again and is hanging out near the Halloween treats! He also likes to ride on your shoulder and behaves well if you attach a leash around his neck. Add your Giant Pet Spider to your costume this year!

Instructions

1. Place your beads on the pegboards as shown. If you are using a clear pegboard, slide the actual-size pattern underneath it.
2. Ask an adult to fuse your designs—see page 4 for further instructions.
3. Assembly: see page 4.







Head and Abdomen

Abdomen Part A






Abdomen Part B

Fusing Instructions—Only Adults Iron



1. Place your pegboard on a flat, heat-safe surface.
2. Set a household iron to the medium setting. Place ironing paper over the pegboard. In a circular motion, begin to iron the project. Do not press down with the iron. As the beads begin to fuse, you will see circles of the beads start to show through the paper. When ironed properly, the beads will still have an open center. Let the design cool.
3. Remove the paper and bead design from the peg board. Flip the design over to expose the non-fused side. Repeat step two. Let cool completely.

NOTE: Beads need heat for about 10-20 seconds per side to fuse evenly. Lift the paper occasionally to see how the beads are fusing. Depending on the size of the project, additional heating time may be required. **DO NOT OVER-IRON** the beads as it will make the centers of the beads close and can make the assembly you do with your project more challenging.

ASSEMBLY

Cut 1 black bead stem to 8" to create the spider's back legs.




Cut 1 black bead stem to 6.5" to create the second set of legs.





Cut 1 black bead stem to 5" to create the third set of legs. Cut two 2.5" pieces to create the front legs.



- 1 Slide the large Abdomen piece and the Head piece onto the body.






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


Insert the small body pieces through the openings of the Body as shown, making sure they lock in.

Insert the Head pieces and the Abdomen pieces A, B, and C through the Body's cavities, making sure the pieces interlock in the large Abdomen.




4 Insert the 8" stem through the last cavity in the bottom of the body until both sides are equal. Repeat with the other two stems. Apply adhesive to secure and let dry.

Use white paper clay to create 4 spheres: 2 at about 1/2" diameter and 2 at about 3/8" diameter. Push a black bead into the center of each sphere. For the fangs, create two small cone shapes then flatten the wider ends. Let the pieces dry completely.



6 When the eyes and fangs have dried, glue them to the spider as shown.

Glue the shortest stems under the spider's head for the forelegs. Let dry.
